AXIS BASE FOUND IN IRAQ!

SSU CONFIRMED IN KUT

Heavy fighting has been reported 25 miles southeast of Kut.

When Allied troops arrived at the scene, at least four SSU helicopters and four KV-47 wrecks were initially found. There were also clear evidence of the presence of Axis fortifications, both above ground and an underground facility.

A security lock-out has been issued on this event, but unofficial sources states that the bodies of two women has been found, with small caliber wounds to the head.

Has the infamous Axis officer Tina Bauman struck again?

One of the deceased women was described to have "bright red" hair. Could this be the SSU officer and pilot Lt. Eva Korouchenko?

All SSU officials have refused to comment on the matter so far.

INTELLIGENCE FAILURE?

Additional hostile activities have been reported just a couple of days after the fighting in the Kut area.

Outside of the coastal village of Um-Qasr the wrecks of three Axis aircraft and three transport walkers have been found.

There are also several unconfirmed reports of the presence of at least three landing crafts.
